
Choice of schools

Courses

The courses consist of 15 hours teaching a week, from Monday to Friday. Classes are taught betweeb 09.00 to 12.30, with a full break between lessons one and two and a shorter break between lessons two and three.

There is a preliminary test on the first day of the course. This will allow us to assess the students' command of English and enable us to place them in a class appropriate to their level.

The course material and the teaching methodology will be appropriate to the age and interests of the class. The course material will be supplemented, as appropriate, by role-playing, listening, pronunciation and intonation exercises, games and songs.

The courses concentrate on developing communication skills and fluency, without neglecting grammatical structure, idioms and extending the vocabulary base.

Each class is taught by two teachers. This adds variety and exposes students to different teaching styles and pronunciation. We feel that relevant and enjoyable lessons will help the students to learn quickly.

Classes are generally formed by 8-10 students, with a mix of nationalities (where possible). There is a maximum of 15 students per class. We do not accept complete Beginners on our courses.



Our students will enjoy a full and varied programme of excursions and activities.

There is something arranged everyday from Monday to Saturday, as shown in the typical programme. We encourage students to spend Sunday with their host families. Some Group Leaders may arrange extra excursions of particular interest at weekends.

Evening excursions are arranged to suit the age and interests of students. They may include, for instance, the school disco, going to the cinema or a London theatre.

The sporting programme includes: swimming, tennis, volleyball and football. Our schools are within easy reach of a variety of leisure facilities, including ice skating, ten pin bowling, horse riding and discos.

Twice a week, generally on Wednesday and Saturday, all students take part in the compulsory excursion programme.

The cost of the compulsory excursions is included in the course price. Students pay for the cost of the transport and entrances of optional excursions.

The leisure programme is varied, well organised and carefully supervised.

Transfers

We operate a collection service from all London airports. A member of staff will meet students on arrival and take them to the school.
