English Language Studies







The Pathways curriculum is designed in a way that allows students to enter the program on a weekly basis. We accept students at all English levels.

Structure

In the **Pre-Pathways** levels, students are integrated into regular ESL classes where they will learn and practice the foundations of English. Focus will be placed on the development of skills in grammar, vocabulary, reading, writing, listening, and speaking.

In **Pathway I**, students will build on the foundations of English skills, and shift more towards developing the skills which are essential for university bound students.

Pathway Specialized Intensive Course (25 Lessons)

Morning: 20 fifty-minute lessons of academically focused English classes which integrate grammatical structures, guided conversations, pronunciation, speaking, listening, reading, writing, and vocabulary.

Afternoon: 5 fifty-minute lessons which consist of specialized classes tailored to English for Academic Purposes including: Academic Reading & Writing, Academic Writing & Speaking, Business English, Exam Skills: TOEFL, IELTS, and Cambridge.

Pathway Specialized Super Intensive Course (30 Lessons)

Morning: 20 fifty-minute lessons of academically focused English classes which integrate grammatical structures, guided conversations, pronunciation, speaking, listening, reading, writing, and vocabulary.

Afternoon: 10 fifty-minute lessons which consist of specialized classes tailored to English for Academic Purposes including: Academic Reading & Writing, Academic Writing & Speaking, Business English, Exam Skills; TOEFL, IELTS, and Cambridge.

Intensive or Super-Intensive Premier Course

The ideal course for combining class-based instruction with private lessons in a comprehensive program that focuses on your individual needs. It includes 2-3 private sessions per week plus 5 hours self-study in the Learning Centre.

In the final level – **Pathway II** students will shift towards English for Academic Purposes. They will work on refining the skills that they learned in the earlier levels; however, the focus will move to those skills that will be necessary for life as a university student. In Pathway II, students will attend workshops that focus on note-taking techniques, summarizing lectures and building and developing research and presentation techniques.

Specialized Electives

Fluency

Our Fluency elective focuses on listening and speaking through communicative practice and reinforcement. Presentations, project work and cooperative tasks are used to further develop confidence in spoken English.

Exam Skills

Our Exam Skills class helps students prepare for English proficiency tests such as IELTS, Cambridge (FCE and CAE) and TOEFL. Practice tests are used to give students extensive preparation in all aspects of these tests.

Academic Reading & Writing

This class is also structured to help prepare students for university or college, but the focus here is on reading and writing. Students practice writing formal essays and read and analyze both fiction and non-fiction pieces.

Business English

Our Business English curriculum combines the best in academic business knowledge with practice for everyday business situations. Group and individual work and case studies are used to simulate a business environment.

Academic Writing & Speaking

This class focuses specifically on writing and speaking for academic purposes. From writing comprehensive reports to giving oral presentations, this class helps you prepare for university or college-level English classes.

Free Academic Preparation Class

In addition to the elective classes, and to further aid in student progression, a free academic preparation class is offered to all students in a number of different formats. This class is free for students who are not on track to improve on schedule, for students who need remedial support in their weaker skills, for students who require further standardized test practice and for students who want to accelerate their improvement rate.

The Academic Preparation Class may include:

- ▶ Small group tutorials focusing on specific needs such as writing and grammar.
- ▶ Supervised homework study sessions with a teacher.
- ▶ Formal peer mentoring sessions overseen by the Director of Studies.
- ▶ Workshop sessions on study skills, organization and cultural adjustments.
- ▶ IELTS/TOEFL and/or other standardized test practice.

Application Process

1. The student completes our Online Level Assessment.
2. The student writes a short essay expressing their interest in the Pathways program and their desired programs and sends it to the Pathways Director.
3. The Pathways Director will then provide a timeline of how many weeks the student will need to study in order to reach the level required by their chosen institution.

English for Academic Purposes (EAP) - courses that help students develop the academic English skills needed for success in college or university courses. These programs typically last for two semesters. (one year)

Certificate - require the completion of two semesters (one year) of study.

University Transfer - programs or credits taken at the college level for one to two years, which will allow students the option to transfer to university.

Diploma - require the completion of at least four semesters (or two years) of study.

Advanced Diploma - an Advanced Diploma is granted after six semesters (three years) of study.

Associate Degree - an undergraduate academic degree awarded by colleges and universities upon completion of studies lasting two years.

Bachelor's Degree - consists of four years of study, and offers the best of both worlds: a solid foundation of theoretical knowledge and the practical skills to apply this knowledge in the real world.

Graduate Certificate - require students to possess a previous university degree or a college certificate or diploma for admission. These programs typically last for 2 semesters. (one year)

Master's Degree - An academic degree given by a university after a student completes at least one year of pre-scribed study beyond a Bachelor's degree.

Co-op - these programs include scheduled periods of employment in related industries within the academic year. These placements may be paid or unpaid positions and may be a requirement for graduation.






