COUNTRY

Canada prides itself on its cultural and geographical diversity and has been cited as one of the top countries in the world for its standards of education, life expectancy and quality of life. Alberta is a province in Canada with one of the highest standards of living. It offers a clean, unpolluted environment, peaceful lifestyle, and beautiful scenery from extensive plains to the majestic Rocky Mountains, as well as forests, lakes and rivers.

Lethbridge is a vibrant community of more than 90,000 people set against the foothills of the Rocky Mountains. The city is situated 200 kilometres (two hours) south of Calgary and 100 kilometres (one hour) north of the U.S. border. Lethbridge has a rich history in First Nations culture and Lethbridge College is situated right on indigenous Blackfoot territory.

The city provides many amenities found in larger centres, including upscale shopping, dining and live local entertainment. It also remains a safe, secure place to live and is known for its recreational activities, running and hiking trails, parks and nature reserves, all within minutes of our campus. The city is very welcoming and accessible for students with public transit connecting the college, shopping centres and entertainment areas. The cost of living is among the most affordable in Canada. Lethbridge is one of the sunniest cities in Canada with more than 320 days of sunshine per year. Our weather is pleasant with warm summers and mild winters.



Alberta has four distinct seasons: winter, spring, summer and fall. Average high temperatures during the day range from 25° C in July to -2° C in January. In September, when classes begin, the days are still warm and the grounds of the campus are green. In October and November, the leaves turn red and yellow and the temperatures begin to drop. Canadian winter weather begins in late November and can last until early March, bringing snow and colder temperatures. By April, spring turns the country from winter white to green. Warm, dry weather in July and August combined with longer daylight hours make our summers perfect for outdoor activities. Remember that you will need to have varied clothing for each season. You will be able to find any specialty clothing you may need for any particular season in Lethbridge.

HOW TO APPLY

- Step 1. Choose a program you'd like to study from the list on the previous page or by visiting our website: lethbridgecollege.ca/programs.
- Step 2. Review program requirements, noting when your program has an intake and the applicable deadlines.
- Step 3: Apply online at lethbridgecollege.ca/apply.
- Step 4: If you would like to stay in our on-campus residence, please complete an Application for Residence form and submit the form with the residence application fee (\$25 CAD).
- Silem 5: Submit your required documents, including educational credentials and official transcripts.
- We will contact you with your next steps. Once you have been accepted, you will receive an Offer of Admission letter. Sign and return the Response to Offer of Admission letter, including the required deposit.
- Step 7. You will receive an acceptance letter in the mail. With this, you will be able to apply for a study permit.
- Step 8: Apply for your study permit at your local Canadian Embassy or High Commission.

English language proficiency requirements

Students whose first language is not English who are applying for programs other than ESL must provide one of the following:

- Lethbridge College English for Academic Purposes program completion with a minimum grade of 60 per cent
- TOEFL- Score of 550 (213 for computer-based testing) or an iBT score of 80
- IELTS Score of 6.0 with no band below 5.5

Note: Practical Nursing has higher IELTS or TOEFL requirements:

- IELTS Academic, with a minimum band score of 6.5 in speaking, 6.5 in listening, 6.0 in reading, and 6.5 in writing
- TOEFL internet based test score with a minimum score of 22 in speaking, 23 in listening, 21 in reading, and 25 in writing
- Successful completion of at least three consecutive years of full-time study at an English senior secondary or post-secondary school.

Courses are offered year-round and each semester:


