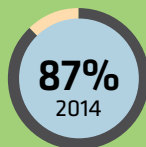

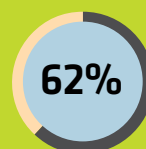
Lincoln University has one of the highest graduate employment rates.

Choose Lincoln University

Lincoln University is one of New Zealand's oldest tertiary education institutions and the only specialist land-based university in New Zealand. Founded in 1878 as a School of Agriculture, the University has long been held in high regard for its land-based research.

This unique history combined with more recent growth in land-based disciplines means Lincoln University now occupies a specialist position that covers globally-significant areas of learning such as agribusiness; agricultural science; soil, plant, food and animal science; bioprotection and biosecurity; conservation and ecology; environmental management; supply chain management; marketing; property; spatial planning and landscape architecture; sport and recreation and tourism management.

Canterbury

As New Zealand's specialist land-based university, it's perhaps fitting that Lincoln University should be located in a rural setting.

Lincoln is a thriving township in the Selwyn District of Canterbury, 20km south of Christchurch. Although the town has a permanent population of around 2700 people, it is in many ways a student town, which sees its population grow to 7000 during term-time.

Less than half an hour's drive or bus ride away is the South Island's largest city, Christchurch. With a population of around 340,000, Christchurch is also the second major business centre in New Zealand. It's an exciting time to be living, studying and working in Christchurch. The city is in the process of transforming itself into one of the world's most modern and sustainable cities.

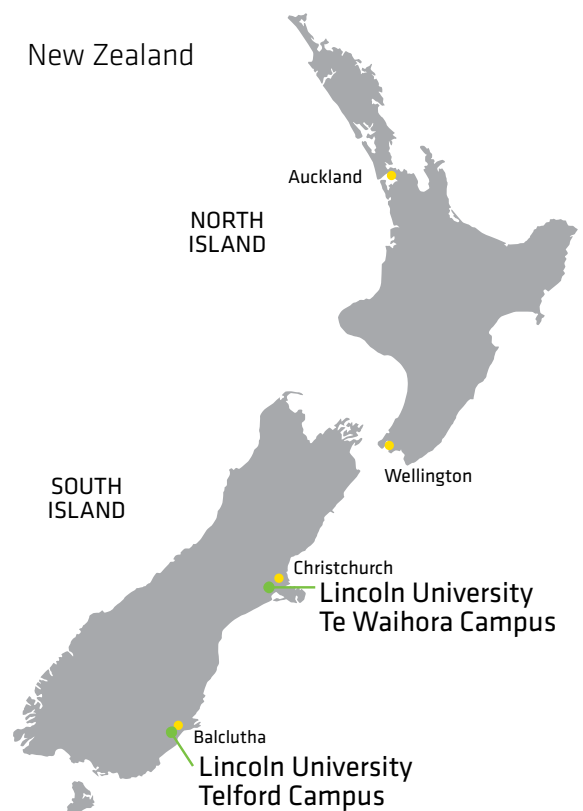

Sub-Degree Programmes

Certificate in English for Academic Purposes (EAP)

You can study EAP at Lincoln to improve your academic English. On completion of the EAP certificate you can meet the English language requirements necessary for entry to further university study. The EAP courses have monthly intakes. www.lincoln.ac.nz/english.

Certificate in University Studies

The Certificate in University Studies prepares students for further study which can lead them into a university degree. Listed here is a small selection of the scholarships for international students:

English for further study award

Any student who successfully completes a minimum of 12 weeks EAP will receive a fees rebate award, to the value of \$NZ 5,040, when they enrol in either the Certificate in University Studies, Diploma in University Studies, Telford Certificate and Diploma, or an undergraduate degree.

Postgraduate pathway

Postgraduate students from Thailand, Vietnam, Indonesia, South America, Russia and China from an official Lincoln University partner university, or who hold a government scholarship to study PhD or master's programmes, can potentially qualify for 12-24 weeks fee waiver for EAP. Please see the International team for more details.

International taught master merit scholarships

Qualifying international students will be awarded with a NZ\$10,000 scholarship towards the overall cost of their study in any 180 credits taught master's programme. Students must have at least a GPA of 75%, or B+ average in the last year of their bachelor's degree to meet the requirement.

Code of Practice

Most international students are not entitled to publicly funded health services while in New Zealand. If you receive medical treatment during your visit, you may be liable for the full costs of that treatment. International students (including group students) must have appropriate and current medical and travel insurance while in New Zealand.
