DID YOU KNOW?

Universities accept a wide range of qualifications, including BTECs Once you've done your GCSEs, you've got three main options to choose from. The most important thing is finding the option that suits you best.

BTECs

BTECs and other vocational diplomas usually last up to two years. They involve a significant level of practical work, as well as completing assessed coursework and, in some instances, taking exams. They carry UCAS points, which are aligned to those for A Levels, so you can still progress to higher education if you wish to. Alternatively, you can pursue employment or an apprenticeship.

A LEVELS

A Levels last for two years and allow you to focus on the academic subjects that you enjoy the most. It's an academically demanding route and is entirely exam-focused. Students usually progress to higher education, or may pursue employment or an apprenticeship.

APPRENTICESHIPS

Apprenticeships last between one and four years and are available in many sectors, offering hands-on experience, a qualification and a wage. You can progress from intermediate to higher apprenticeship, ending with a qualification equivalent to a degree. Ofsted rated Loughborough College Outstanding for apprenticeships in June 2017, reporting that our apprentices "exceed expectations and progress to higherlevel apprenticeships, further training and education or sustained employment."

Progress Tutors undertake regular reviews to make sure that students are progressing on their course and achieving their targets. If students have any problems with their course, their Progress Tutor will support them by liaising with other College staff and Tutors. They will try to help resolve any issues related to the student's academic programme of study, as well as personal issues, which may be affecting their progress.

At the start of the programme, students meet with their Progress Tutor to discuss study plans, timetables, and the structure of the Loughborough College International Foundation Programme, and life at the College. The Progress Tutor also guides and supports students during their UCAS application, specialist advice is given to assist students in making their university choices, and deciding which course is best for them.

The Loughborough College International Foundation Programme is a flexible learning experience, offering both intermediate and higher level Academic English Study (AES) classes, as well as a great selection of subject-specific modules. The programme consists of four key elements:

1. Academic English Study

These classes help students to develop the skills essential for success at university, including note-taking, researching, extended writing, presenting, and summarising.

3. Tutorials

Progress Tutors work closely with students throughout the programme, supporting them in their academic development and monitoring their progress. They offer advice in regular meetings, helping students to apply through UCAS for university and ensuring that they receive the best possible education during their time at the College.

Length of programme: Two semesters each of twelve weeks teaching, plus an introduction week for each semester, two revision weeks, and an exam period over two weeks.

2. Subject-specific modules

These focus on equipping students with the foundation-level subject knowledge required to progress on to more specialised study at university. Written and developed over many years specifically with international students in mind, they will help you learn all of the essential subject knowledge for your university study.

4. IELTS support

English language tutors are on hand to support those students who need to improve their IELTS score before starting their degree programme. You will study 3 hours of IELTS per week, intensively and have access to the British Council's Road to IELTS software, which is free to our students providing an additional 120 hours of study material.

COURSE PATHWAYS AND MODULES

The subject-specific modules selected will depend on the individual student's chosen degree programme and its entry requirements. Students are required to take eight modules in total and each module is worth 15 credits. The entire course therefore consists of 120 credits. Each module contains 150 Guided Learning Hours (GLH).

Students will choose their pathway, which contains some compulsory and some optional modules. These modules have been selected as the most suitable for progression, maximising their eligibility for their undergraduate subject choice.

- Each module consists of 150 Guided Learning Hours, which is divided between tutorials, lectures, seminars, practical classes or guided independent study as appropriate to the module.
- All students study four modules per 12-week semester. Each module consists of 4.5 hours of in-class contact time per week, totalling 18 hours per week.
- IELTS lessons will be an additional 3 hours per week for those students with less than 6.5 overall.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

- An Academic IELTS for UKVI score of 5.0 overall, with no less than 4.5 in each part.
- Five C grades or above at GCSE or O level (or other equivalent international qualification)
- Maths is required for either Business Maths or Applicable Maths modules
- A relevant Science is required for either Physics, Chemistry or Biology modules
- Three C grades or above at AS Level Three D grades or above at A Level
- Applications will be welcomed from students who have successfully completed other high school qualifications. Please contact the International Office for further advice.

ASSESSMENT

- The programme aims to prepare students for Higher Education and for the different kinds of assessment that they can expect to encounter at a university in the UK. Learning is assessed through a combination of coursework assignments and endof-module examinations. Some modules rely entirely on coursework assessments; whereas others are assessed through a combination of coursework and end-of-module examinations. Examinations take place at the end of Semester 1 (January) and Semester 2 (June); whereas coursework deadlines occur regularly throughout the academic year.
- Coursework assignments range from summations and extended essays to presentations, research projects, and laboratory reports. Students receive full support during classes and tutorials in preparation for their assessments and are also helped to develop the planning and time management skills required to succeed in them.

Each module on the Loughborough College International Foundation Programme is marked using the following grading criteria:
