



Whatever job you're looking for, employers need you to have a good standard of maths and English. At some point you'll have to fill in paperwork or work with customers or suppliers so a basic level of maths and English is essential.

Maths and English will be part of vocational courses for all students aged 16–19.

We work with local job centres on short training programmes that give work skills training to unemployed people.

If you're 16-24 years old, unemployed and not sure how to find work, then our new traineeship programme could help you get work experience with an approved employer in the sector you want to work in. You'll get:

- Support with interview skills, CV writing and job applications

ENGLISH AND MATHS

We can help you improve your English and maths.

If you're 16 to 18 and studying full-time, then these will be part of your course anyway. If you're 19+ we can also run English and maths courses alongside subjects like Access (see page 25) to make sure you're ready to progress to the next stage of your learning journey – which for Access would be a university course.

You can also just study English and maths on their own. Maybe

it's been a while since you left school and you want to improve your job prospects. Or maybe you want to help your own children with their schoolwork and need more confidence to do that. Talk to us to see what's available.

English and maths courses are often free though you'll need to meet our entry requirements and do an assessment to get onto a course. And space is always limited because they're so popular.



AS PART OF ANOTHER COURSE

AS A STANDALONE COURSE

If you're 16-18 and studying full-time with us, then English and maths will be part of your course.

If you don't already have GCSE grade A*-C then we'll try to move you towards that goal. If you do already have top grades in GCSE then English and maths will still be part of your studies as literacy and numeracy are essential skills for the job market and you should be challenged to improve your English and maths all the time.

We also run a tailored course to help raise English and maths skills alongside key business and IT skills. This can help improve your ability to either progress to a higher-level course or to find work. Ask us about our 'Passport to Study and Work' programmes if you're between and 16 and 20 and are looking for extra help.

And don't forget that if you're taking one of our popular Access courses (see p25), you may also get English and maths help alongside your course.



If you want to study English or maths, we've got several courses that could be just right for you. You don't have to be taking another course with us to take this course and you can study just English, just maths, or English and maths at the same time.

English

You can take a GCSE with us or learn at 'Functional Skills' level and work up to a GCSE in time if you want. Functional Skills runs from Entry Level through to Level 2 and we'll give you a short assessment to put you on the right course. We run our English classes in the morning, afternoon and evening and also some Saturdays, they may be one or two days per week. After your assessment, we'll tell you which level you can study at and put you in a group with students of a similar ability to give you the best learning experience.

Maths

You can take a GCSE with us or learn at 'Functional Skills' level and work up to a GCSE in time if you want. Functional Skills runs from Entry Level through to Level 2 and we'll give you a short assessment to put you on the right course. Our maths classes run in the morning, afternoon and evening and also some Saturdays, they may be one or two days per week. After your assessment, we'll be able to put you in a group of people with similar abilities to give you the best learning experience. And if you're studying at Functional Skills level,

ENGLISH FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Our English for International Students courses and qualifications help you to live, work and study in the UK and improve your international career opportunities. Many of our English courses can be studied alongside our other courses.

ENGLISH FOR SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES

If English is your second language and you live in Britain permanently you'll find our English courses helpful for your life, work or study. We offer nationally recognised qualifications at six levels: Beginner, Entry Levels 1 to 3 and Levels 1 and 2. And you can choose to study in the daytime or the evening.

ESOL for 19 years and older

Merton, Tooting, Wandsworth and Roehampton

This course focuses on your English. Through exercises in speaking, listening, reading and writing with our experienced ESOL tutors you'll build your confidence and practise English for everyday situations. With class outings and group activities, we make sure that learning is enjoyable as well as educational.

ESOL for 16-18 year olds

Merton and Wandsworth only

When you learn English with our experienced ESOL tutors you also study IT, personal and social development, job skills and maths.

You study three days a week at our Wandsworth or Merton Campus. To practise your English in different settings, and to help you make friends, we have plenty of class trips. You can also use our Enrichment Rooms and sports facilities on campus.

We have regular parents' and carers' evenings too.

You'll need to take an assessment so we can test your level of English and recommend the best course for you. This will be at the campus you want to study at. The 24+ Advanced Learning Loan covers your tuition fees and you only pay it back when you're earning over £21k. You'll receive a minimum of £300 towards your fees. It's not means tested and you don't have to be in work to get the loan. And if you go straight on to complete a unilevel course, the loan is wiped off!

ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION

Level 3

Entry requirements:

You'll need to show knowledge of the subject and a commitment to research and study at this level.

Many universities ask for GCSE English and maths A*-C as well as your Access certificate for entry onto their courses so ideally you'll have these already. If you don't already have A*-C in GCSE English and maths, you can take an English and/ or maths assessment with us and still get onto our Access course depending on your results. You can look at our English and maths courses online or ask for more information at your interview.

Assessment:

To help you be a better artist, you'll study a variety of techniques and processes helping you focus on more advanced subjects as you progress through the levels. The course is a great introduction to art, design and media and will help build your skills ready for future study or work. During the course you'll have the chance to create your own animation, organise your own photoshoot and design your own accessories.

You must complete all set projects before completing a self-directed end of year final project. Units include:

- A project in 2D or 3D
- · Drawing and painting
- Printmaking
- · English and maths.

Assessment: Continuous assessment and coursework, including exhibitions.

Entry requirements: Three GCSEs A*-G including English or maths; OR other related qualifications and experience. You'll also need to show some art and design work at interview, which could include sketchbooks, drawings, etc. If you don't have examples of your previous work, we may ask you to complete some practical tasks as part of your interview to make sure the course is a good match for you.

Next step: You can progress to our Level 2 course in art and design.

Level 2

Art and Design

University of the Arts London Diploma Level 2

START: SEPTEMBER

DURATION: 1 YEAR

If you want to get started in art and design, this course helps you look at the creative process and principles of art and design but not in a rigid course structure. Your projects, which last from two to six weeks, help you apply new skills in more and more complex ways to push your learning.

And there'll be plenty of visits to galleries, museums and exhibition spaces to open up your eyes to new ideas and practices.

Assessment: Assessment will take place at the end of each project, every four to six weeks. You'll also be assessed through individual and group presentations.

Entry requirements: Three GCSEs A*-D including English or maths; OR a relevant Level 1 qualification with appropriate levels of English and maths. You'll also need to provide a portfolio of art and design work at interview – which could include sketchbooks, drawings, etc. If you don't have a portfolio, we may ask you to complete some practical tasks as part of your interview to make sure the course is a good match for you.

Next step: Move up to our Level 3 course in art and design run with the University of the Arts London and build your skills.

Assessment: Continuous assessment and coursework, including exhibitions.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs A*-C with English at A*-D; OR a relevant Level 2 diploma at least at merit plus English assessed by us to be at an appropriate level You must also show a portfolio of your art and design work at interview, which could include sketchbooks, drawings and samples. If you

don't have this, the interview panel will give you tasks to complete for interview.

Next step: As part of this course, you're eligible to apply to University of the Arts, London through our progression agreement with them. This helps you with feedback on your portfolio and interview preparation. You can also progress to the HNC in Graphic Design here at South Thames College or to an art and design degree at university or art college. You can also look for related work in a range of art, craft and design specialisms.





FASHION AND TEXTILES

CODE: CB489

Are you the next fashion icon or entrepreneur? Can you work under pressure to tight deadlines and deliver top quality products with innovative ideas? You'll develop skills to produce and market your own range of jewellery, clothes and home accessories to support you into work in jobs like visual merchandising, stylist, retail display, pattern cutter, tailor or prop and costume making for theatre and film. At the end of the course you'll have a professional portfolio of digital and traditional disciplines to present for further study or work.

FINE ART AND SCULPTURE

CODE: CB489

This is your chance to get involved in live briefs and competitions and begin to market yourself in the artistic industries. We'll help you build your portfolio for further study or work. Studying fine art and sculpture will help you develop a variety of experimental and traditional material to make statements about yourself and the world around you. Foundation Diploma (FAD) Level 3 or 4

START: SEPTEMBER
DURATION: 1 YEAR
STUDY MODE: FULL TIME
LOCATION: WANDSWORTH
CODE: CB490. CB525

This is a great course if you've already turned 18 and want to get on track for art and design at university. The foundation diploma prepares you for specialist art and design studies either at art college or university. The course is challenging and intensive and you'll build on your skills as well as discover plenty of new ideas, media and ways of learning.

You'll explore a broad range of disciplines in fine art (drawing, painting, printmaking, photography, fashion, surface design, 3D sculpture, spatial design, graphic design and illustration) with growing independence until your final projects. Most of the course is based on practical work, so you'll respond to simulated briefs and meet deadlines. You'll develop your critical independence and ability to respond in a thoughtful and creative way while meeting the needs of the brief. You'll also study art history and contextual studies projects where topics include:

- Exploratory stage research
- · Recording and responding
- Media experimentation
- Preparation and progression
- Pathway stage information and interpretation
- Personal experimental studies
- Extended media development
- A final major project.

If you study at Level 4, your final project and written work will be assessed at a higher level, and against slightly different marking criteria. We will discuss the different levels with you and what will work best for you at interview.

Assessment: Continuous assessment and coursework.

Entry requirements: Depending on whether you study at Level 3 or Level 4, you'll need GCSEs grades A*-C in maths and English and a Level 3 qualification, eg an A-level, which will ideally be art and design related (or equivalent). If you're an older student, you might have a Level 2 qualification and some appropriate work experience so talk to us about how we can help find a route onto this course for you. You must be 18 years or older. You'll need to bring a portfolio of your recent art and design work to interview. If you don't have one, you'll be set tasks by the interview panel.



This course offers technical training in accounting and teaches you specialist knowledge and skills to progress to a further qualification in accountancy or a related field. At this level you'll master more complex financial processes including financial accounts for sole traders and partnerships, VAT administration and professional ethics.

- Preparing final accounts for sole traders and partnerships
- · Costs and revenue
- Indirect tax
- Professional ethics
- Spreadsheets.

Assessment: You'll be assessed throughout the year with an online computer-based test marked by the AAT automatically so you see your provisional result immediately.

Entry requirements:

- AAT Level 2 Accounting Certificate
- City & Guilds Level 2 Bookkeeping and Accounting or a relevant degree
- Relevant work experience will also be considered
- You must be working in an accounting role
- You must be 18 or above at the start of the course, pass an interview and entry test in maths and English.

Next step: You could apply for jobs as a section leader in a large organisation or as a senior bookkeeper in a smaller organisation. You could also act as treasurer to clubs and voluntary societies. You could progress further in your career and continue to the AAT Level 4 at South Thames College.

Accountancy Apprenticeship

An accountancy apprenticeship is great if you're thinking about becoming a chartered accountant and want to get hands-on experience by learning on the job.

You'll pick up vital skills and knowledge including:

- Cash management
- Determining asset value and what fixed assets are
- · Costing and VAT
- · Professional ethics in accounting
- Different practices for sole traders and partnerships and fixed assets.

You'll also learn about employer rights and responsibilities and study functional skills in maths, English and IT. You'll leave with either a Level 2, 3 or 4 in Accountancy if you complete the apprenticeship successfully.

Apprenticeships have three different levels: Intermediate, Advanced and Higher. At Intermediate you'll pick up the fundamentals of a role and key skills to start your career. With Advanced you'll learn more in-depth skills. At the Higher Level you'll gain greater skills and more detailed knowledge of that business area. You can work through the levels or start at a level depending on your current experience and qualifications.

Assessment: A mixture of workplace observation and college-based observation, portfolio building and online exams.

Entry requirements: To become an accountancy apprentice with us, you must:

- Have four GCSE grades A*-C including maths and English; OR a Level 2 accounting qualification; OR relevant experience
- Be 16 or older
- Be legally allowed to work in the UK
- Have lived in the UK for the last three years
- Have no qualifications at Level 4 or higher eg a HNC.

Materials fees: Remember that you may need to invest in some smart clothing appropriate to an office environment. Our team will discuss this with you and any items you need for college.

During the course you'll also work on your English and maths to help you fill in any gaps in the qualifications that are key to you studying at the next level up and improve your job prospects. If you want to leave straight into work, this course could improve your understanding of key tasks that you'd need in almost any job.

Details on this course are still being finalised, so please ask us about this passport to study and work for more information.

Entry requirements: This course is aimed mainly at 16-18 year olds, though we may take you students up to 20 years old. You'll need to have an interview with a tutor to check this course is right for you and that you can work comfortably to keep pace with the abilities of other students on the class.

Next steps: Look in more detail at a subject that interests you now that you have the foundations. This might be IT, business or another specialist study area like travel and tourism.

This course is an ideal introduction to business studies. If you want an office-based job or to work in retail, this course will give you a great overview of business. It builds on the skills you already have and introduces you to new aspects of the business world so your future career options become even more interesting. You'll also have a work placement to give you real world experience, previously this has been with companies like Tesco. Office Angels and Next. We also run several visits a year to companies, often based in the City, to see the different roles and practices for the organisation - this will help you understand how different business sectors work. Previous visits have included Bank of Tokyo and Red Star Insurance. We also take part in other initiatives as they become available. for example, last year our students took part in a Dragon's Den style event run by Wandsworth Council. You'll study a variety of business topics including:

- Business organisations
- Financial management
- Marketing and sales
- Enterprise
- Customer service
- Business planning as part of this module you'll work in teams to develop a business plan and raise money for a community project
- Business communication and information
- · Recruitment.

Assessment: You'll be assessed throughout the year with coursework and exams.

Entry requirements: Three GCSEs A*-D including English or maths; OR a relevant Level 1 qualification plus English and maths assessed by us to be at an appropriate level.

Materials fees: You'll be given a book list and you'll be expected to buy the main textbook for the course. Our library is well-stocked with everything else you need.

Next step: Continue on to a Level 3 course if you would like to get the entry requirements for university or for better job prospects. You could also take up an apprenticeship.

90 OR 180 CREDIT COURSE:

Achieve a 90-credit diploma in your first year of study then top up to 180 credits on the extended diploma in the second year. The extended diploma gives you much more detail on the subject, it's the same as three A-levels and is a great route into university. If you already have 90 credits from another college, you can choose to top up to the extended diploma with just one year of study.

This course develops the knowledge, understanding and skills you'll need to become a decision-maker in business. You'll be able to demonstrate your knowledge and understanding in a way that suits you best. We also run several visits a year to companies, often based in the Citv. to see the different roles and practices for the organisation – this will help you understand how different business sectors work. Previous visits have included AXA insurance and the UK's top law firm. Clifford Chance. As part of our work with the Career Academy, we have guest speakers from big business who are experts in their field, to talk about their journey to their role, what you need to do to be prepared for interviews and work and what employers are looking for. Some of our students have internships through Career Academy too. Before our students have interned with top companies like Liberty Insurance, Citibank, Halifax and Barclays - some have even been offered full-time work afterwards. We have also run a successful 'study buddy' programme with a London university to help prepare our students for applying to university and being prepared for higher-level study.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs A*-C including maths or English (with the other at grade D or equivalent) OR a relevant Level 2 diploma at least at merit with GCSE maths or English A*-C (with the other at grade D or equivalent). If you're 16 to 18, you'll need to achieve your GCSE in English and maths A*-C by the end of your course if you don't already have this. If you're 19 or older, you must have GCSE A*-C in English and maths or their equivalent to enrol. Please note that Level 2 functional skills is not a suitable equivalent.

Materials fees: You'll need to pay for your Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check (formerly CRB). This is normally paid at enrolment.

If you're considering a career in counselling or want to enhance your role in the workplace, you'll learn a range of counselling skills on this course. At the end of the course you should be able to apply the skills you have learnt in a counselling session and understand their relevance to practice.

Materials fees: You'll need to pay for your DBS check. This is normally paid at enrolment.

If you work as a trainee and unqualified dental nurse and want to develop your skills, this course will give you the knowledge you need to progress. The course is designed to fit around your practice job. If you're successful you'll be able to register with the General Dental Council.

There are 15 units you need to complete. These include:

- Medical emergencies
- · Dental examination and anatomy
- Cross infection control
- Oral health education
- Root canal treatments
- Dental radiographs (x-rays)
- Support during teeth extraction and minor oral surgery
- Support for provision of fixed and removable prosthesis.

Assessment: There are four short multiple choice tests at the end of each unit. You'll need to keep a portfolio of your course work and essays. An assessor will visit your practice at agreed times to carry out treatment observations.

Entry requirements: You need to be employed as a dental nurse by a dental surgery for at least 20 hours a week. If you are working in an orthodontic or domiciliary practice you'll need to arrange to work in a general dental surgery for at least two days a week for the duration of the course.

Next step: Once you've completed the course there are a number of different options you could progress on to. These include: dental hygiene or therapy, dental practice management, radiography, oral health education, orthodontic nursing, special care dental nursing, dental sedation, treatment coordination, dental nurse assessment and

teaching dental nursing.

DBS Checks

In line with government policy, students on health and social care, childcare and health science courses may need a DBS check (formerly CRB — Criminal Records Bureau — check). You'll need to pay the fee for this.

If you want a career in social care or to take a degree in social work, sociology, psychology, social sciences. social policy, nursing or other care-related courses, then this course is for you. We emphasise real-world experience for you through a work placement, so you'll be working two days a week in a setting like a children's nursery or a care home. Completing your work placement is an essential part of your assessment and is well regarded by universities and employers, so should give you the edge in your next steps. As you'll be working with vulnerable groups, you'll need to have a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check (formerly CRB) before your course. You'll have the chance to hear from professionals – like midwives and nurses – who are already working successfully in this area. They'll talk to you about their career path, the sorts of skills and behaviours you should demonstrate and what opportunities there are for people prepared to work. We'll also take you on field trips to relevant exhibitions and events, such as Nursery World at Olympia. We're also growing our work in competitions, including WorldSkills where our students produced care plans and did key health checks. Competitions are a great way to show you new ideas and stimulate your enthusiasm.

The course covers:

- Communication and supportive skills for care work
- Research for care
- Sociology
- Psychology
- Health promotion
- Practical caring skills
- Health and safety
- Life span development
- Issues for people who use care
- Anatomy and physiology.

Assessment: An external assessment and internally assessed assignments with practical and theoretical activities focusing on real work situations. You'll be assessed on your practical skills during your work placement.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs A*-C with English and maths at A*-D; OR a relevant Level 2 diploma at least at merit plus English and maths assessed by us to be at an appropriate level. You'll complete a work placement as part of this course so you'll also need to pass an enhanced DBS check.

Materials fees: You'll need to pay for your DBS check. This is normally paid at enrolment.

Next step: Move on to other health and social care courses at South Thames College. From the 90-credit diploma, move up to the extended diploma. This course is ideal if you want to study biological or related science courses at university or if you want a practical career in the sciences. There are plenty of practical activities to boost your understanding of scientific techniques including researching river pollution, measuring energy content in food and looking at a heartbeat under a microscope. You'll study aspects of biology, chemistry and physics as well as work on your English, maths and IT skills. Training in science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) is vital in the UK and global economy today and the skills and knowledge you learn on this course could really get you ahead in the job market. You'll study six mandatory units plus optional units such as:

- Scientific investigation
- Perception of science
- Biochemistry
- Biomedical Techniques.

As part of the course, you'll have the chance to work in NHS pathological and research laboratories to give you real-world experience and help you understand the professional standards and behaviours expected in the science industry. And if you're interested in medical science, especially obstetrics and midwifery, there is an option to take part in a short course and competition run each year by the Foundation for Infant Loss Training. Entry requirements: A relevant Level 2 qualification at least at merit with appropriate levels of English and maths. Alternatively substantial salon experience with English and maths assessed by us to be at an appropriate level. You'll also have a practical skills assessment to make sure the course is a good match for you.

Assessment: Practical-based tests and written assignments.



Guitar Making and Repair Diploma Level 1

START: SEPTEMBER
DURATION: 1 YEAR

STUDY MODE: FULL TIME

LOCATION: MERTON

CODE: CB199

This course starts you on the road for the skills needed to make a guitar, including different construction methods and different styles of instrument. The course may include visits to auctions, museums, and instrument collections to help build up your knowledge of the development and history of guitars.

Topics include:

- · Woodwork skills and theory
- · Making a ukelele
- · Selection of timber for sound
- Guitar bracing patterns
- Basic metalwork and how to make small tools
- · Selecting and maintaining tools.

You should aim to complete at least one instrument and this will include how to find and choose the right wood for your project.

Assessment: The tutor will give you feedback throughout your course.

Entry requirements: Three GCSEs including maths and English; OR other related qualifications and experience. You'll also need a short interview with a tutor who will check the course is right for you. To guarantee a place, you should aim to book at least a month before the course starts.

Materials fees: There is a materials fee to cover the timber used for your first instrument. You might want to buy your own tools to help you practise and develop at home. Talk to a tutor for more information about this.

Next step: Move up to our Level 2 guitar making course to build on the skills you've learnt or to complete a project.

Guitar Making and Repair

City & Guilds Diploma Level 2

START: SEPTEMBER
DURATION: 1 YEAR

This course teaches you how to make a guitar, including different construction methods and different styles of instrument. You should aim to complete two instruments and this will include how to find and choose the right wood for your project. You'll also complete some common guitar repairs and possibly more major repairs like head grafts and replacing fronts, which leads onto our Advanced Guitar Making and Repair course.

Assessment: The tutor will give you feedback throughout your course.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs grades A*-C in relevant subjects including maths and English; OR a related Level 1 qualification. You'll also need a short interview with a tutor who will check the course is right for you. To guarantee a place, you should aim to book at least a month before the course starts.

Materials fees: There is a fee to cover the use of specialist tools in our workshops. You'll need to source and buy materials for your projects throughout the course – your tutor will advise you on this.

Next step: Set up your own business as a guitar maker and repairer, or progress to our advanced guitar making course to improve your skills. You could also re-enrol on this course if you are still completing a guitar project or want to perfect your techniques.

You should plan to complete a guitar in a style of your choice and develop your repair skills.

Assessment: The tutor will give you feedback throughout your course.

Entry requirements: Ideally you'll have completed our other guitar making courses or have equivalent experience. If you haven't done a course with us already, you'll need a short interview with a tutor who will check the course is right for you. To guarantee a place, you should aim to book at least a month before the course starts.

Materials fees: Included in the course fee though you might want to buy your own tools to help you practise and develop at home. Talk to a tutor for more information about this.

Next step: Set up your own business as a guitar maker and repairer or take another of our musical instrument making courses. If you want to set up your own business, you could consider the part-time business, finance or marketing courses we offer to improve your reach to customers.

Units include:

- Understanding behaviour in public sector employment
- Physical preparation and fitness for the uniformed services
- Leadership and teamwork in public services
- Government policies and the public services
- Citizenship and diversity
- Understanding discipline within the uniformed public services.

Assessment: Continuous assessment through assignments and practical observations.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs A*-C and English GCSE at A*-D; OR a relevant Level 2 diploma at least at merit plus English assessed by us to be at an appropriate level.

Next step: From the 90-credit diploma, move up to the extended diploma. From the extended diploma, progress to university-level courses in public services or apply to start a career in the ambulance, fire, police or armed services.

This course covers:

• Analysis of English from a foreign learner's point of view

 Development of language skills, resources, lesson planning, teaching, pronunciation, and classroom management

 Input sessions on language awareness and methodology, observed teaching practice and observation of experienced teachers. **Assessment:** A portfolio of coursework and observation of teaching practice.

Entry requirements: CELTA is open to native and non-native speakers of English, but the course requires a good level of analytical awareness of the language as well as a high level of written and spoken English. Non-native speakers should normally already have the Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE) qualification or equivalent. This course is for students 20 years old and over. You need to have two A-levels or a degree (or equivalent). If you have recent experience of learning a second or additional language this might be an advantage.

Next step: DELTA or PGCE (specialising in language).

Whether you're new to the education sector, already working in teaching, or want to move into a school setting, this course will teach you the range of knowledge needed to support a teacher in the classroom.

The course is based on the national occupational standards for supporting teaching and learning in schools.

Assessment: The course is assessed by a portfolio of evidence. You'll also be visited by an assessor to observe you supporting learning in the workplace.

Entry requirements: You'll need a reasonable level of literacy and numeracy. You need a paid or voluntary teaching support placement of six hours a week or more for the whole of your course. You'll need to arrange this before you enrol. It can be in a primary, secondary, or special care school but not a nursery. You'll need to arrange with your placement school for your DBS check. We can interview you before you arrange your placement but you must bring proof of your placement to enrolment to get onto the course.

Materials fees: You'll need to pay for the DBS check to do your placement.

Next step: Progress on to a Level 3 course in supporting teaching and learning.

Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools

Level 3

START: SEPTEMBER

DURATION: 1 YEAR

STUDY MODE: PART TIME DAY OR EVENING

LOCATION: TOOTING

CODE: CB262

Build on your skills learnt at Level 2 and develop your capacity to deal with a variety of familiar and unfamiliar situations in the classroom, using a range of professional skills.

You'll be able to show that you can carry out self-directed activities under guidance and may have limited responsibility for directing the work of others. You'll be able to apply knowledge and skills in a range of complex areas. The course is based on the national occupational standards for supporting teaching and learning in schools.

Assessment: The course is assessed by a portfolio of evidence. You'll also be visited by an assessor to observe you supporting learning in the workplace.

Entry requirements: You need a Level 2 qualification in Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools or another closely related Level 2 qualification. Before you enrol you need to arrange to do at least ten hours a week of paid/voluntary teaching support for the duration of your course. Your placement can be in a primary, secondary, or special care school of your choice. Nursery schools are not suitable. You'll need a DBS check to start your placement. You should arrange this with your placement school. You can apply and be interviewed before your placement is arranged but you must bring proof of your placement confirmation to enrolment.

Materials fees: You'll need to pay for the DBS check to do your placement.

Next step: If you don't want to go directly into working in a classroom, you could move on to a foundation degree in teaching.

Teaching: An introduction to EAT, DET and PGCE All Levels

START: FEBRUARY

DURATION: 1 WEEK

Considering a career in teaching adults or working as a trainer? This informal session will give you an insight into what the job involves and the different routes you could take to move into this area. Teaching is a demanding and fulfilling career choice that people come to at various stages of their life, often after other employment. During the session you'll find out about:

This course introduces you to effective teaching methods. It features a variety of teaching and learning approaches including seminars, group work, peer teaching, tutorials, and presentations. Course content includes:

- Lesson planning
- Communication skills
- Resource development
- Different assessment methods.
- Legislation in education
- Professional reflection.

Assessment: You'll build up a portfolio of assignments over the course. You'll also carry out a short session of teaching in class.

Entry requirements: You'll need to demonstrate good levels of written English. You'll also need a willingness to develop teaching approaches that are appropriate for adults with diverse educational and cultural backgrounds.

Next step: Once you've achieved this award, you'll be in a much stronger position to apply for teaching hours in the further education and skills sector. You may also want to enrol on the DET/PGCE course and become a fully qualified teacher.

90 OR 180 CREDIT COURSE:

Achieve a 90-credit diploma in your first year of study then top up to 180 credits on the extended diploma in the second year. The extended diploma gives you much more detail on the subject, it's the same as three A-levels and is a great route into university. If you already have 90 credits from another college, you can choose to top up to the extended diploma with just one year of study.

This course looks at various aspects of tourism, broadening your knowledge and skills to improve your career prospects in the travel and tourism industry. You'll have the chance to take part in an overseas residential field trip that will broaden your understanding of how airlines and airports operate and how hotels and visitor attractions work abroad and attract international customers. This will underpin your class assignments. As part of the course, you'll also have a two-week work placement in the sector. Previously, our students have worked with companies including Travelodge, Thomson and National Express. We run several visits a year to give you an understanding of how UK visitor attractions operate successfully; this has included the London Aguarium, Tower of London and Thorpe Park.

There are compulsory and optional units including:

- Customer service
- · Business of travel and tourism
- UK, European and long-haul destinations
- Resort representatives
- · Marketing.

Assessment: Continuous assessment of coursework, role play, presentations and case studies. There are also some externally moderated exams.

Entry requirements: Four GCSEs A*-C including maths or English (with the other at grade D); OR a relevant Level 2 qualification at least at merit.

Materials fees: You'll wear a uniform as part of your course. Depending on your circumstances, the cost varies and this will be assessed when you join the course.

Next step: From the 90-credit diploma, move up to the extended diploma in travel and tourism. From the extended diploma, you can go on to a HNC at South Thames College or elsewhere. Or go straight into work in roles like a tour operator, rep, or cabin crew.

FEES AND FINANCE

Aged 16-18

If you're 18 or under on 31 August 2016 and are a UK/EU student, you won't have to pay any fees at all. All tuition, registration and exam fees are free. You might have to pay for some materials however – things like art materials or a hairdressing kit.

Aged 19 or over

If you're 19 or over on 31 August, you'll probably need to pay tuition fees, exam fees, plus the College registration fee. Fees have been set for some courses (though still can change), so please ask at Student Services or check our website for the most up-to-date fees.

Sometimes you can get a reduction on your fees, for example if you're on Jobseeker's Allowance. However, it's best to check with us as our fee policy is updated from time to time.

Higher education

All students on higher education courses pay fees, though you could get a student loan to help with the cost of your course from Student Finance England. Also, if you have a disability, learning difficulty or medical condition that affects your learning, you could be eligible for the Disabled Students' Allowance. For details on eligibility and how to apply, you can speak to Andy Branscombe in our Learner Support Team or download our leaflet from www.south-thames.ac.uk/fees.

Materials

On some courses you'll be expected to pay for materials. Some courses also need specialist equipment to complete the course, eg beauty therapy kit or chefs' whites. If you're on benefits, you might be able to get help to pay for these through our Learner Support Fund.

Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS)

Students on some of our courses, like childcare, may need a DBS (formerly CRB — Criminal Records Bureau) check. You'll need to pay the fee for this when you enrol.

Financial Support

Money shouldn't be a barrier to you doing well. Our advice team has plenty of experience helping students get grants and other funding to help them complete their course.

You may also be eligible for help with childcare costs through Care to Learn or our childcare bursary.

For free and confidential advice about financial support and an assessment of your circumstances, speak to the Welfare Advisers in the Advice Centres (Merton and Wandsworth) or Student Services at Tooting.

24+ Advanced Learning Loans

If you're 24 or older, are a UK resident and are taking your first Level 3 or Level 4 course then the Government's 24+ Advanced Learning Loan could help pay for your course. Like a student loan – you don't pay upfront or pay anything back until you're earning over £21k a year. It's not means tested and if you go straight on to complete a higher education course, the loan will be wiped off.

Access Fund

Available if you're on low income and get funding for higher education from Student Finance England. You'll be given money for travel and assistance to be paid each term so long as you attend. The amount

you'll receive depends on how far you live from College. Pick up a 19+ Learning Support application form from Student Services or email student services@south-thames.ac.uk

Learner Support Fund

This is financial support from the College to help with the costs of travel and any books or equipment you need for your course. To be eligible, your household income needs to be $\mathfrak{L}16,190$ or less. Ask for an application form at Student Services.

Free College Meals

Depending on your circumstances, you could get money towards lunches at the College until you're 25. Our welfare advisers can help see if you're eligible for this government scheme.

Financial help for university-level courses

A student loan might be open to you if you're on a higher education course. Also, if you have a disability, learning difficulty or medical condition that affects your learning, you could be eligible for the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA). For details of DSA and how to apply, speak to Andy Branscombe in our Learner Support Team or download our leaflet from www.south-thames.ac.uk/fees.
