Canadian Studies

To succeed in a Western academic environment, students need knowledge about Canada and what will be expected of them as they pursue their university and college studies.

Part of the Canadian Studies course takes the students out of the classroom in order to provide a dynamic and realistic overview of Canada. Students gain further insights into Canadian identity, history, and culture. During this course, students practice and combine the four communicative skills in the context of reading and listening to relevant material, class presentations and discussions, journaling and researching.

Students learn culturally appropriate ways to conduct themselves. This course also encourages students to compare course content with their own cultural understandings and the experiences they gain through the activities out of the classroom.
