ELCI students with sufficient TOEFL scores can participate in the Half-Half Program with WOU and if successful can matriculate into the full-time academic program in the university.


TOEFL Waiver Program





Available Programs

English + Geology

Learn English and science at the same time! The theme of this program is "Volcanoes, Tsunamis, and Dinosaurs." Oregon has many geological wonders. Students will visit famous Mt. St. Helens which erupted in 1980, tour the beautiful Columbia River Gorge, travel to John Day Fossil Beds and dig for real fossils (and keep them!). They can even participate in a lecture and demonstration of a Tsunami Simulator at Oregon State University!

English + Wild West

Oregon was settled in the 1840's and was the end of the Oregon Trail which brought thousands of pioneers from the east to the fertile valleys of Oregon. In this program, you will learn all about the rich history and traditional culture of Oregon. You will also learn English and enjoy exciting activities such as cowboy roping, rodeo, square dancing, and visiting a native American reservation.

English + Art

In this program, students will take English lessons in the morning, and attend various art workshops outside of the school in the afternoon, such as pottery making, glass blowing at the Oregon Coast, art museum tours in Portland, etc. Students will also attend art classes at Linn-Benton Community College, and take on leadership roles and work with their Ameircan teammates to set up an art camp for American students.

English + Culinary Adventure

Oregon is famous for its seasonal berries, nuts, and fresh seafood. Aside from the English lessons surrounding the topic of culinary arts, the students will also attend culinary classes at Lin-Benton Community College, visit the Portland farmers market, visit the world-famous Tillamook Cheese & Ice Cream Factory, enjoy local cuisine twice a week in local restaurants, and much more!















