#### How we teach

We take a learner-centred approach which develops core skills such as teamwork, responsibility, problem solving and critical thinking.

We make classes fun to motivate students and believe that this helps them become inquisitive, independent learners.

All our programmes develop learners' confidence through age-appropriate themes and activities, a learning-centred approach and collaborative experience.

Teams are made up of qualified, appropriately experienced staff. Our team has a combination of subject specialists and language specialists. Staff have age-specific teaching qualifications and experience.

We aim to provide learners with authentic opportunities to practice their language skills such as:

- Conversation in social situations
- Questionnaires and quizzes in school and on trips

#### How are students placed in classes?

When learners arrive on their first day. they complete a placement test. We find out what each pupil knows, what they want to learn and what interests and motivates them.

We place students in a class at an appropriate level where they will feel comfortable yet challenged to develop their language skills. Learners are also placed according to their age to ensure that all children are at the same stage cognitively.

#### How is progress measured?

Pupils aged 8 upwards are given a weekly progress test which is in the form of a game or quiz to help them understand how much they have learnt.

It allows the teachers to evaluate who is ready to move to a more challenging level or requires further support.

#### Observation and reporting

Younger learners are monitored and assessed by teachers through informal observation.

All students receive a certificate and report upon completion of their course.

# **English language ability levels**

All Globeducate schools offer English as a Foreign Language (EFL). English levels are described below according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

### Beginners (A1 – A2)

Students should be able to understand and use familiar everyday language and phrases and be able to interact in a simple way. They should be able to introduce themselves and ask and answer basic questions and be able to name familiar everyday objects.

### Intermediate (B1 – B2)

Students should be able to use and understand language related to their own lives and daily routine. They should be gaining confidence in talking about their lives e.g. work, school, leisure and be starting to deal with less familiar situations. Some may be able to produce text on topics which are familiar and describe experiences and events.

### Advanced (C1 – C2)

Students are starting to interact fluently in English and can write clearly and accurately on a range of topics. They may have a good vocabulary associated with specialist subjects and will be able to differentiate between social, colloquial language and business/ formal language.

# **course The English School Experience**

In our core programme for English learners, students accelerate their skills through inspiring activities & projects in a British-style school experience, enhanced through London excursions.

**During the English School Experience, students boost** their language through inspiring activities, projects and London excursions.

The programme provides students with a 'British style' school experience which develops a command of English language skills in academic subjects.

Each week focuses on a particular theme based around culture, history, commerce or the environment. The thematic nature of the course means students learn within a meaningful context and will not repeat the same lesson or excursion, no matter how long they stay.

Every student takes a placement test on their first day so the academic team can group children appropriately by the level of English and age.

# Student ages

## 3 – 4 years old Nursery

The focus is on creative and play based learning and the development of communication and social skills. Children use song, dance, drama, art and construction to improve language skills.

## 5 – 7 years old **Lower Primarv**

Learners work collaboratively through project-based activities, researching together to improve English language and communication skills. Weekly excursions take place in central London and are directly related to the learning that is taking place that week.

# 8 – 9 years old **Upper Primary**

Learners take part in exciting discovery-led activities with a focus on all communication skills: speaking, listening, reading and writing. Lessons and activities are linked to a weekly project. Weekly excursions take place in central London and are directly related to the learning that is taking place that week.

# 10 – 17 years old Secondary

Learners build confidence and competence through projects and focused lessons which include group work, worksheets, questionnaires and research tasks. Weekly excursions take place in central London and are directly related to the learning that is taking place that week.

# course Active English in London

This course is only for the 14 – 17 age group as it involves interacting with London! Active English means active learning, using and applying English language skills in real-life contexts.

This is a dynamic course, travelling on London buses and the Tube (students plan the routes!) and visiting iconic London landmarks.

English Language levels are improved through direct interaction with the environment, with learning opportunities skillfully crafted by the specialist Active English teachers, who are always on hand to guide the group.

Students immerse themselves in the English language and experience British culture up close.

#### Food

Food Our school caterers provide freshly prepared meals every day and both meat and vegetarian choices are available. All meals are served with fruit and vegetables. We can cater for special dietary needs. Please let us know of your requirements when booking.

#### Day-long excursions

Depending on the time of arrival/departure, students may (or not) be able to attend excursions on the day of their arrival/departure.

#### Travelling

Please ensure that your children travel with an authorisation to leave their country of residence. Please note that certain airline and railway companies do not accept unaccompanied minors under 12 or 14 years old. We recommend purchasing travel insurance.

#### **Pocket Money**

Students are responsible for their own money. We recommend no more than £50/€50 a week per pupil.

#### **Airport Transfers**

It is the parents'/agent's responsibility to arrange flights. Please inform us of the student's flight details and request airport transfers if required by completing the Student Travel Details section on the application form.

Globeducate holiday courses offer an accompanied transfer service from specific airports for an additional charge. Students under 16 will be collected by the team directly from the relevant airline company. Students aged 16 or over should make their way to the exit of the terminal where they will be met by our reception team who will be holding a sign.

Ideal times for arrival or departure are between 12.00 and 18.00 on the allocated transfer day. On their return, our staff accompany all students right up to check-in and will only leave the airport after the student's flight has taken off. ICS will provide students and parents with the mobile phone number of the person in charge of the transfer.

#### Safety
