Intense Yoga and Meditation



General Information

Immigration and Arrival Card:

All passengers arriving from abroad are required to fill in the arrival card for clearing immigration. ONLY tick 'Leisure / Holiday' on the card. If asked by Immigration Officer the reason for your visit, you should state the same.

Currency:

You are only allowed to bring a very small amount of Indian Rupees to India from abroad. You can exchange money at Currency Exchange places - at the airport (open 9.00 – 18.00) or at the nearest bank/money exchange counters. One has to keep the exchange receipt as this will help you to reconvert unspent Indian Rupees back to your original currency when you leave India. The closest ATM is 5 minutes' walk from the school

Community Life:

Your roommates (if any) will be international students with different levels of English. We suggest you speak English as much as possible, as practicing the language will reinforce your efforts in class.

Public Transport:

Buses offer the cheapest way of travelling. There's a bus stop near the school, where you can take buses to Margao, Colva and Panjim.

Bicycle is one of the best ways to move about giving you the freedom to go where you want and at your own pace gliding through the natural beauty.

Rented motorcycles and scooters with helmet are also available. An international driving license is mandatory along with a helmet to drive in Goa.



Course Books:

We do not provide course books however, our teachers customize the lessons based on the students' ability and requirement and handouts are given.
